Currently in the editorial pipeline are luminary videos of Rodolphe Chabrier, Hichael Hofstein, Bill Lorton, Richard Hollander, Van Ling, Toni Pace Carstensen, Nancy St. John, Syd Mead, Lesley Robson Foster, Mark Stetson and Susan Zwerman.

Global participation in the Archive initiative is being embraced by sections worldwide. We have had luminary videos submitted by France and Georgia. A number of other sections have submitted their luminaries for approval including Germany, London, Montreal and New York & Toronto. The Bay Area is scheduling their second round of luminaries, December 3<sup>rd</sup>.

We are inviting all sections to participate so we can capture oral histories of VFX luminaries around the world. It's highly recommended to choose a point person from each section to be the liaison to the Archive committee. Thanks to Kim Lavery and Shannon Cassidy for their consistent and effective outreach.

The Digital Museum user interface has made great progress and is in the demo stage. No small feat considering the massive amount of content to organize.

- One of our members, Susan Zwerman, has produced (with Katie Cole of Perforce) 3 Webinars on Virtual Production, now playing on YouTube. Susan has also set up a number of field trips to various Virtual Production studios.
- The CTE certification continues to move forward. This CA curriculum can then be used as a prototype by other states and potentially other countries. The CTE program is for high school students, but in general, education and presentations need to start with middle school students.
- One of our members, Rose Duignan, has coordinated 14 vfx department specialists who will speak over the course of 1.5 years for the Apprentice Speaker series being promoted by the California Education initiative for High School students, BRIC and AME.
- The Veteran's initiative with the JVS (Jewish Vocational Service) continues to move forward and a Vets Resources page may be set up as there are Federal and State grants for scholarships (for Vets) and work related subsidized programs (for employers) to know about. The committee is working on creating a informational video showcasing how transferable skills from the army can be adapted into the VFX Field.
- We have continued our outreach efforts including in person presentations at the college and high school levels and continue building a library of these presentations that can be recycled to other high schools and colleges.
- Continuing to reach out to Access VFX in London to share some of the great work they're doing.
- Continuing to reach out to other industry groups, such as the TV Academy and PGA to cross-pollinate ideas/processes.
- Continuing to add and seek new committee members interested in Education.

## Health and Wellbeing Committee November 2022 Report

#### 2022 Summary:

Throughout 2022 the Health and Wellbeing Committee have continued to pursue initiatives to enhance the Health and Wellbeing offering to our membership alongside the already implemented MAP program "Members Assistance Program".

- We intend to obtain more stats on use of the Members Assistance Program (MAP) by our membership and to continue in promoting it.
- We are actively pursuing our list of potential Health and Wellbeing discounts for members. Approaches have been made and continue with relevant companies to see if we can attain benefits for the membership.
- We have had some nibbles.

- We still intend to develop a live webcast of some sort to promote VES wellness initiatives.

The committee has been active on the following projects:

- **1.** We completed the rules and procedures for the **VES Emerging Technology Award**, which were announced in mid-August and Sebastian presented to the last Board meeting. The Emerging Technology Award subcommittee was formed in preparation for vetting Tech Award submissions for the 21st Annual VES Awards.
- **2.** As the board was previously informed, the Cinematic Color project has been regrettably shut down due to disagreements over copyright.
- **3.** Nick and Francois have released the calendar year 2023 **VFX reference** platform CY2023.
- **4.** The VFX Linux Task Force (lead by Nick) released the VFX Linux Distribution recommendation report: <a href="https://bit.ly/VFXlinux22">https://bit.ly/VFXlinux22</a> which was presented at the ASWF Open Source Days at SIGGRAPH 2022. - **5.** We are looking forward to supporting the **Work from Home** Committee, Chaired by Gavin Graham and Co-Chaired by Colin Campbell, which is currently drafting a survey.
- **6.** A new Security Best Practices document is being drafted with a particular focus on a new set of WFH guidelines following the latest MPA Content Security Program.

- **7.** The guidelines for the **Virtual Production Glossary of terms** have been published at <a href="https://www.vpglossary.com/">https://www.vpglossary.com/</a>, and the Committee is drafting community guidelines for the VP Glossary Discord channel. Discord community is growing through new discussion channels (Job postings, Best Practices, Future trends, etc.).
- **8.** Sam Richards and Joseph Goldstone are working on a summary presentation of the camera metadata survey.

Every one of these topics is ever changing and could be the focus of an individual whitepaper, so there's a lot to figure out in terms of making concrete progress per the Committee's remit.

Initial focus in terms of concrete action is now focused on our proposed Survey to help establish an accurate snapshot of where the industry is right now, and where the workers/membership would like it to be headed. This has had EC first round feedback, and might be tabled as an Agenda item for the Board Meeting in November if everyone agrees that we've got it over the line.

**BAY AREA SECTION REPORT** 

November 2022

#### **Summary**

The San Francisco Bay Area has focused less on online content and more on a return to live and in-person events. Our section is built on the close relationships and strong sense of community, which in many cases pre-dates the founding of the VES. Our endeavor in this post pandemic period has been to offer safe and secure opportunities for our members to gather in person, while staying within the CDC, State, County & City Departments of Public Health Guidelines.

As with 2021, we are noticing a smaller drop between RSVPS and attendance - showing that people are signing up when they intend to attend than pre-pandemic.

#### **BAY AREA SCREENINGS**

The Bay Area has traditionally relied on 3 key venues for member screenings: Pixar Animation Studios, The ILM Premier Theater, and 32 Ten Studios, site of the original ILM. These locations have strong emotional and "exclusive" appeal for our members as they are prestige sites that are not easily accessed by the public. To date, we have only just been able to tiptoe back into one of these venues (ILM). This has led to significant frustration by our board and some of the members who noticed early in the summer that the key tentpole filmes (Top Gun: Maverick. Jurassic World: Dominion, Lightyear and others) were screened elsewhere but not by our section.

We continue to work with alternative venues- Delancey Street Screening Room and Variety Club. The downside of these venues is size (they each hold less than 100), accessibility (none have readily available parking and one is close to the baseball stadium) and cost (each is between \$800-900 per screening - a steep price when only a few members might attend. Still we've found that having screenings (even if poorly attended) is better than not - and have absorbed the costs with several successful events since the frustrations experienced in May and June. We will have fewer VES sponsored screenings during the awards screening period, when the studios sponsor screenings at our available venues, and pay for it out of their budgets.

There have been no online or in person events aside from screenings over the summer months as most of the board members were busy with work or travel.



#### **VES BAY AREA SUMMER BBO 2022**

On September 10, 2022 the Bay Area hosted our annual VES Summer BBQ at McNears Beach in San Rafael. We had around 100 VES members and guests, our friends from the Star Wars costume club, the Golden Gate Garrison, 501st Legion. We had music, great food from a local caterer, and warm, but gray and windy weather. There was a definite sense of reconnecting.

Jeff Johnson moderated a Zoom panel with Matt Plec (Apple) and Frankie Liu (Nvidia) - both speaking for themselves, not their employers - talking about what they saw at Siggraph that looked interesting for our VFX community. It was a good conversation, though attendance was light. It reminded everyone of the positive role the VES has as a 'town square', where our professionals can interact with peers and get to hear first-hand reports about trends and innovations. This could be a model for future events to recap major conferences like Siggraph, GDC, or Siggraph Asia, and share with the members.


